Honors

Honors in the Major

Highly-qualified students majoring in anthropology may apply to graduate with honors in the major.

Eligibility

To be eligible, students must have completed at least 60 credits, taken ENGH 302 Advanced Composition (Mason Core) (http:// catalog.gmu.edu/mason-core/) for the social sciences, completed 15 credits of anthropology (including ANTH 114 Introduction to Cultural Anthropology (Mason Core) (http://catalog.gmu.edu/mason-core/)), and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.30 and a minimum grade of B+ in anthropology courses.

Requirements

If accepted, students complete two honors courses. The first course is an honors section of one of these courses: ANTH 450 Ethnographic Research Methods, ANTH 495 Internship or another course chosen in consultation with the honors director. The second course is ANTH 499 Independent Research, in which students complete an honors paper written under the guidance of an anthropology faculty member. All candidates for honors in the major participate in an honors colloquium. To graduate with honors in the major, students must complete the honors coursework with a minimum GPA of 3.50.

Anthropology, BA/Anthropology, Accelerated MA

Uverview

Highly-qualified undergraduates may be admitted to the bachelor's/ accelerated master's program and obtain a BA in Anthropology and a MA in Anthropology in an accelerated time-frame after satisfactory completion of a minimum of 138 credits. Students with both a BA and MA have a competitive advantage when applying to PhD programs in anthropology.

Students who are accepted into the BAM Pathway will be allowed to register for graduate level courses after successful completion of a minimum of 75 undergraduate credits.

Accelerated Master's Admission Requirements

Students already admitted in the BAM pathway will be admitted to the MA Anthropology, if they have met the following criteria, as verified on the Bachelor's/Accelerated Master's Transition form:

- Minimum overall GPA of 3.25
- Completion of ANTH 490 History of Anthropological Theory
- Minimum grade of B in each advanced standing course
- Successfully meeting Mason's requirements for undergraduate degree conferral (graduation) and completing the application for graduation.
